I wanted to review the roles of a Parish Nurse



Grief Care: Offering support and

guidance to individuals and families experiencing loss, illness, or life transitions. This includes facilitating grief support groups, one-on-one counseling, and connecting members with appropriate resources.

Health Education and Promoter: Serving as a health educator, addressing physical, emotional, and mental health needs in a faith-centered manner. This includes organizing workshops and seminars on topics such as managing chronic illnesses, mental health, wellness practices, nutrition, and preventative care.

Personal Health Counseling: Providing confidential one-on-one health counseling, helping members navigate their personal health concerns and understand their medical conditions, treatments, and options from a holistic perspective.

Faith and Health Relationship: Promoting the understanding that health is a gift from God, and caring for one's body is an act of stewardship. The Parish Nurse will emphasize the integration of prayer, scripture, and faith in health-related decisions and overall well-being.

As the Parish Nurse, I recognize the interconnection of a person's mind, body and spirit. This means there is emphasis on the whole person, physical, emotional, and spiritual needs leading to overall healing and well-being.

I will continue to be at church on Friday mornings from 9:30 to 11:30 am, please drop by to visit!

This month, on October 12th, we are offering a Sunday morning class after service, called "On Love" by Paul Chilcote and Janet Chilcote this class will also be offered on Tuesday at noon if enough interested) Paul Chilcote states "In a world marked by division and hostility, how do we live with genuine love?" Paul and Janet offer a practical path forward through twenty essential practices anyone can begin today.

Faith Over Fear

"God did not give us a spirit of fear, but of power and love and self-discipline." — 2 Timothy 1:7

Fear is not always loud. Sometimes it whispers. It whispers "What if it's not enough?" "What if we don't meet the goal?" "What if people don't step up?" And for individuals: "What if I give and regret it?" "What if I need this later?" These are natural questions. In fact, they're part of being human. But if fear is the only voice we listen to, we'll always play it safe - and the mission God gives us will always feel slightly out of reach. Stewardship - real, spiritual stewardship - is not about coaxing money from people. It's about forming people in faith. It's about inviting one another to live boldly in response to God's generosity. Faith says, "God has provided before. God will provide again." Faith says, "This gift matters. It's not the size it's the trust behind it." Faith says, "We are called to be faithful, not fearful." If your church is entering a stewardship season or making financial plans for next year, listen to the questions - but don't let fear lead. What God has planned for your church isn't rooted in fear, but in power, love, and self-discipline.


