For the past couple of years we've been using a more streamlined form of church governance that combined several of our former administrative committees (Staff-Parish Relations Committee, Trustees, Finance Committee, and Administrative Council) into one Accountable Leadership Board. This model helps to bring greater focus on our mission—to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world—even as we help care for the daily details of hiring and supporting church staff members, caring for the maintenance of the building, stewarding the financial resources of the church, and attending to the overall health of the church.

There are a few vacancies on our Board and those who applied and were elected to the first Accountable Leadership Board have begun rotating off of the committee so additional vacancies will be created as each of them complete their term. Welcome Claudia LaSeure, our AmeriCorps volunteer for Monday's Meal!

Early in 2022, Pastor Wendy and our Accountable Leadership Board became aware of the Community Corps program,



administered through Marshfield Clinic to support various public health programs in Wisconsin including food and nutrition programs like Monday's Meal. We applied and were approved as a host site for a half-time AmeriCorps volunteer to serve twenty hours per week from September 2022 through August 2023. In August, our interview team comprised of Pastor Wendy, Esther Fahm (a member of the Monday's Meal Steering Team), and Linda Bark (a regular volunteer at Monday's Meal) interviewed and approved Claudia La Seure to fill this role as our AmeriCorps member. Claudia is the daughter of Nichole Manson, our former volunteer Monday's Meal Coordinator, so she is already familiar with our meal program. Nichole will still volunteer with us occasionally too as able, but she is returning to school at CVTC, continuing her other employment, and homeschooling her young son so she has understandably had to step back from her role here in order to care well for these other responsibilities in this season of her life.

Claudia comes from a background in food service at several fast food restaurants and a passion both for helping people and for creating delicious recipes with inexpensive ingredients. Her compassion, determination, and can-do attitude have already been an asset to our Monday's Meal program and we joyfully welcome her to our team! In exchange for her service with us, Claudia will receive a modest living stipend through the AmeriCorps program and upon the successful completion of her year of service with us will be eligible for an education award toward future tuition for higher education. We are grateful for this mutually beneficial Community Corps program that can help us continue to improve and grow our Monday's Meal ministry!

On August 21 a group from church and the community took a bus to Plymouth MN to attend "Hope Fest". There were three Christian bands that performed along with the inspirational messages that they shared.

Touch a truck which was held in September in the church parking lot was a huge success. The community rallied behind us and brought in dump trucks, a milk truck, street sweeper, John Deere tractor and school bus. Several of our own members brought in lawn tractors, a 1950 truck and a Gator with barrels that the kids rode around the yard in.

This past week we held the Basketball Skills Clinic for the community and youth were invited to come and spend the afternoon with the UW-Stout men and women's basketball teams. A good time was held by all.

We continue to support Stepping Stones with our "buckets of change" on the 5th Sunday of the month. We have gifted close to a thousand dollars this year so far! Another of our local missions is "Monday's Meal". We have been fortunate to have volunteers "step up to the plate" to organize, cook, serve and support financially this mission. Our numbers typically range from 120 to a high of 180 meals served.

I mention these activities because without your financial help we would not be able to sponsor these programs and missions. Good things are happening at the Menomonie United Methodist Church!

Our general fund is holding steady and bills are all current. We are looking forward to a full winter season with the new boiler without repairs, which will be a real treat! We are anticipating high heating bills so we will see how the winter pans out.

Prayer Time

In my ministry, several people have asked why God doesn't speak to people like God did in the Bible. Their assumption is that any time Scripture talks about God speaking to someone, that person is hearing a literal voice saying words. I think this is a far too limited understanding of how God speaks to us every day. Consider this story told by Scott McKenzie and Kristine Miller. "Every day, on her way to work, Audrey's route took her past a women's penitentiary. Surrounding the building and grounds stood a large chain-link fence topped off with barbed wire intended to keep separate those on the inside from those on the outside. Each time Audrey passed the woman's penitentiary, she saw the women walking the grounds or sitting at picnic tables soaking in a few precious moments of warm sunshine. As she passed, Audrey would quietly say a prayer for the incarcerated women and their families. One day, as Audrey was driving past, she felt a strong urge to pull in. Without fully realizing what she was doing, she turned sharply into the entrance of the prison. In an instant, she found herself face-to-face with a large, intimidating prison guard whose face suggested a humorless disposition. Feeling the awkwardness of the moment, Audrey explained that she had felt God's push to visit the facility and asked if they received volunteers." "The prison guard responded by giving Audrey the business card of the volunteer coordinator and sent Audrey on her way. God's nudge had sent Audrey to an unfamiliar place, and she was courageous enough to go. Soon she started a Bible study class at the prison sharing Jesus' message of love and hope." Audrey believed that the urge to pull into the penitentiary was God speaking to her. I tend to agree. Rather than waiting for a literal voice to speak to us, what if God spoke and called us through our nudges, yearnings, and hopes. That would mean that God is closer than many of us think or realize. It also means that God challenges us more frequently than we realize. But, when we courageously listen to God with a willing heart, we will discover that the result is transformational, not just for us, but for everyone whose life is impacted.


