The Chippewa Valley Habitat for Humanity build is well underway here in Menomonie and YOU can help if you'd like! One side of the twin home that is being constructed on Brickyard Road is a "Faith Build", meaning that churches in our area are especially invited to support the project financially and with volunteer labor. You can visit https://cvh4h.volunteerhub.com/vv2/ to sign up to help at any of the Chippewa Valley locations, whether you'd like to help build (instructions and supervision are provided) or help provide a meal for the builders. On April 5th the Trinity UMC in Elk Mound will be helping with the build, and they have room for more volunteers to help on that day if you'd like to join them. Also, on April 20th Our Saviors Lutheran Church in Menomonie will be helping with the build and they, too, expect to have extra volunteer slots to share if you're available to help on that day. The first step to sign up for either of those days (or any other date or time you'd like to help) is to visit the volunteer hub at the link provided above.

Thank you to all who are helping to provide safe, affordable homes for families in our community!


New Members Class



Community Conversations

On Dec. 2023, at "Community Conversations," at the Menomonie Public Library, we had a discussion of Wealth and Income Inequality. When we asked what the audience would suggest for local or individual efforts that could be done to help with the issue, a member of the audience, Bob Maline, suggested that we could do a grass roots organizing efforts.

We have asked Bob Maline to do a presentation for Community Conversations about grass roots movements. On April 20, 2024, at the United Methodist Church from 12:30-3:30 pm. There will be time for breakout discussions for small group discussions and for refreshments.

Grass Roots Organizing Western Wisconsin (GROWW) is an organization of ordinary people of all ages, walks of life, who have come together to tackle issues impacting our families, homes and communities. At the heart of their mission is the belief that we all have the power to make a difference when we get organized and step into the public arena

Board members Phil Vergas and Bob Maline will share GROWW's story...its vision platform, methods and organizing philosophy. They will share status and updates on several active campaigns including Bridge the Divide for final five voting, People Protecting Pierce for responsible farming, and All in Favor building power through local elections and governing.
